



## **Learning Path**

Using the conceptual model of International Health as starting point, the module focuses on international relations, promoting a critical analysis of models of development, national foreign policy and different modalities of international cooperation that impact, positively or negatively, on the guarantee of the rights and well-being of the population.

Review of international relations theories, its implications and how to put these into action.

Once it is conceptualized, it is important to understand how international cooperation comes about, its modalities according to national foreign policy and other international guidelines.

Participants will analyze and discuss, in a critical manner, how States carry out international cooperation in health, its main actors and the results and impact on the health status of populations.

The module concludes with a critical and proactive proposal of good cooperation practices that can improve, strengthen or establish criteria for other national cooperation processes in the country.

Emphasis is also placed on the development of competencies and skills such as diplomacy, negotiation and advocacy (resources mobilization) and the production and communication of knowledge.
